SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

This show is conducted in accordance with the rules of the Alberta Equestrian Federation and the Welsh Pony & Cob Society of Canada. Each participant in this show is responsible for the knowledge of and is subject to the Cochrane & District Agricultural Society Grounds, AEF and WPCSC rules.

- 1. Exhibitors, parents and/or guardians of minor exhibitors shall indemnify and hold harmless POSH ALTA, the Cochrane & District Agricultural Society Grounds,, employees and/or all horse show officials and employees or volunteers from any and all liability resulting in injury and/or loss sustained by any person, child or ward of such parent/guardian, in any manner occasioned. Be sure to sign the release of liability on back of your entry form. POSH ALTA, its members and executive and/or show owners/leasers or the facility where this show is held, will not be held responsible for any personal injury, loss or damage to any pony exhibited or for any article lost, destroyed or in any way damaged.
- 2. Owner/exhibitor must have a current membership with the one of the following:
 - Alberta Equestrian Federation OR
 - If from another province, your provincial equestrian federation OR
 - If American, a USEF membership

Any entry received without the necessary AEF numbers will be returned. The list of exhibitors' AEF numbers will be submitted to AEF for verification.

- 3. All exhibitors must check in at the show office upon arrival.
- **4. Absolutely NO arrivals before 1:00 PM, Friday, August 1, 2025**. Ponies are only to be stabled in their designated stalls. DO NOT PUT A PONY IN A STALL THAT HAS NOT BEEN ASSIGNED TO YOU. Only one pony per stall, except in the case of mare and foal pairs. Stalls must be vacated by 6:00 PM or no later than one hour after the final class is completed, whichever is later, on Monday, August 4, 2025.

5.Entries: A Copy of BOTH sides of the registration papers MUST accompany each entry for a registered pony. If you have a current measurement card, include a copy of it. Exhibitor numbers will not be issued until ALL paperwork is in order. PLEASE take the time to fill out your entry form correctly and completely, including owner and exhibitor AEF & WPCSC numbers (if competing in Welsh breed classes). **EARLY BIRD ENTRIES** MUST BE IN THE HANDS OF THE SHOW SECRETARY, KAREN CHORNEY, NO LATER THAN JUNE 25 2025. REGULAR ENTRIES, NO LATER THAN JULY 11, 2025. Only entries received before July 11, 2025 will be included in the show program. Late entries accepted at an additional \$10.00/class.

- **6. Payment of Fees:** E-mail Money Transfer payable in CAD Currency will be accepted. Early bird fees must be paid in full by June 25, 2025. Regular fees must be paid in full by July 11, 2025 with paper work and signatures complete before numbers will be issued or stalls assigned. Late entries will be accepted up to July 25 2025, but with a \$10 late fee per class and stalls are not guaranteed. **Refund Policy:** No refunds will be given unless a class is canceled, or upon presentation of a Vet Certificate/Doctor's note and notification to the Show Secretary **before the start of the show.** No office charges will be refunded. No money will be refunded for scratched entries. The Show Committee's discretion will be used in other instances. Decisions of Show Management are final.
- 7. Photocopies of registration papers (for registered ponies) and appropriate fees shall accompany entry forms or the entry will not be accepted. Sire/dam points can only be calculated for registered offspring. All registered ponies shall be entered and compete under their full registered name. No phone entries will be accepted. All classes are open to all pony breeds, with the exception of the Welsh breed classes. To compete in Welsh breed classes ponies must be registered with the WPCSC or the WPCSA. PLEASE SEE THE SECTION ON WELSH BREED CLASSES FOR MORE INFORMATION.
- **8. Management reserves unto itself the right** to refuse or cancel any entries, disqualify riders, drivers or exhibitors without incurring claim for damages. The show committee reserves the right to cancel or combine classes if there are insufficient entries or split classes if there are a large number of entries.
- 9. Numbers will be assigned to each pony. Riders and handlers are to ensure they are wearing the correct number.
- 10. Exhibitors are encouraged to be on time for their classes. Please assemble ponies outside the arena while preceding class is being judged. If you need the gate to be held, please notify the ring steward. Gate holds are two minutes, an additional three minutes will be allowed for a requested tack change. Gate will not be held for longer than five minutes.
- 11. No persons shall be allowed in the ring except the judge, show officials, official show photographer and one handler per pony. Exceptions are: Leadline, Leading Rein, Costume Class, Liberty and Driving Classes. Passengers are allowed in all driving classes. Headers will be allowed in the ring once driving ponies are lined up. Junior drivers under 14 years of age shall be accompanied on the vehicle by a knowledgeable adult. Failure to comply shall incur elimination. A second handler may be allowed in line classes, when necessary, to run out a pony/horse. Only one person may handle the animal at any given time. Assistance in showing from outside the ring is prohibited.
- 12. Ponies entered in hunter and/or jumper divisions may compete in a MAXIMUM of two consecutive height divisions. Ponies entered in dressage may compete in a MAXIMUM of two consecutive divisions.
- 13. Competition age of ponies competing in performance classes:
 - 1)National Dressage Pony Cup Classes 4 years and over (under saddle classes only)
 - 2)Sport Pony Under Saddle 3 years and over

- 14. ANY abuse toward any animal or Show Official/Staff will be cause for immediate ejection from the show and premises, WITHOUT REFUND.
- 15. <u>Junior exhibitor</u> A person who has NOT reached his/her 18th birthday as of January 1st of the current year. No Junior under 18 years of age will be allowed to show a colt or stallion one year of age or older in any class.
- 16. Senior Exhibitor (adult): A person who HAS reached his/her 18th birthday as of January 1st of the current year.
- 17. Animals in championship line classes are only required to move at the judge's request. All animals that are eligible for a championship shall compete unless excused by the show committee. Champion & Reserve Champion in performance classes are won based on points earned throughout the division. All classes will award points, with the exception of the following: novelty classes, lead line and clear round jumper classes.
- **18.** All entries in performance classes will be WALKED to and from the show ring. All riders, regardless of age or level, must wear ASTM/SEI, BSI/BS, EN, AS/NZS, or CE VG1 01.040 2014-12 (provided they are BSI Kitemarked) approved protective headgear at all times, with chin strap fastened, when mounted or driving at any AEF sanctioned Wild Rose competition unless specifically exempted by the rules of the discipline. Any competitor violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further activity until such headgear is properly in place. NOTE: Protective headgear is advised and welcome in all classes of any age group, with no judging penalties.
- **19. All animals entered in National Dressage Pony Cup classes** must provide a permanent measure card to the show <u>OR</u> have the pony measured at the show. Ponies can be measured on the morning of Saturday, August 2nd. Those entering Royal Winter Fair qualifying classes are strongly encouraged to have their ponies measured as they WILL be measured at the Royal. All other animals may be measured at the judges' discretion. For more information about the National Dressage Pony Cup visit: https://dressageponycup.com/shop/membership is not required to compete at this show.
- **20. Sanctioning:** This Show is provisionally sanctioned by AEF. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current AEF and WPCSC rule book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith and in compliance with these rules.
- **21. Officials:** All officials have been asked and agreed to officiate. POSH ALTA reserves the right to change any official should circumstances warrant a change.
- 22. Health: As required by AEF, all ponies participating in the Western Canadian Pony Classic must have received Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1 & 4) vaccinations within the last six months, with a 21-day grace period before the event. Ponies that are unable to receive either of the vaccines due to medical reasons must provide a letter from a veterinarian on official letterhead along with the entry form.
- 23. Halter: For in-hand divisions that are judged concurrently, double points and double ribbons will be awarded. Exhibitors must enter both divisions.
- 24. Driving: For animals in harness, animals must be fully bridled while hitching and unhitching. Removing the bridle from an animal harnessed to a vehicle, or leaving an animal unattended while hitched; anywhere on the show grounds will result in the instant elimination and removal from the show grounds. A properly attired groom or passenger is required for all pairs, tandems, unicorns or 4 in hand, capable of rendering assistance in case of an emergency. Failure to comply will result in elimination from the competition. Wire-wheeled vehicles will be acceptable in the Carriage Driving division at this show.
- 25. Welsh Futurity Classes: Futurity classes are open to ponies/ cobs nominated and paid for by June 25, 2025. No late entries will be accepted. Futurity classes must have a minimum of four entries for futurities to pay out. These classes will not be judged separately, but will be judged in conjunction with the regular classes. All Welsh classes for juvenile ponies (2 years and under) include a futurity component.
- **26: Get of Sire and Produce of Dam:** All animals shall have competed in their respective classes in the Breeding Division in order to show in a Group class.
- **27. Ribbons:** Ribbons for 1st -6th place will be given in all classes. Rosettes will be given for all Grand and Reserve Grand Champions. Rosettes/Sashes will be given for Supreme and Reserve Supreme Champions.
- 28. Height: All animals competing in the Western Canadian Pony Classic must be 14.2hh or under, unless otherwise stated.
- NO MARES SHALL BE BRED ON THE GROUNDS
- NO EXHIBITOR WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE RING WITHOUT HAVING SIGNED THE WAIVER
- NO DOGS OR OTHER PETS ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS
- NO ALCHOHOL ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS

There will be a concession stand on the grounds.

WELSH PONIES AND COBS

Welsh Breed Classes:

All ponies competing in Welsh Breed Classes must be registered in Section A, B, C, D, or part bred with the Canadian Livestock Records Corporation (WPCSC) or the Welsh Pony & Cob Society of America (if owned by an American resident) or the Welsh Pony and Cob Society (Great Britain) and must be entered under their registered name and shown in the section in which they are registered.

All ponies foaled in Canada and owned by a Canadian resident must be registered in the studbook of the Canadian Welsh Pony & Cob Society. All ponies under one year of age must be eligible for registration. Foals less than one month old cannot compete. All ponies/cobs must have Welsh registration papers and be shown in the last registered owner's name to appear on the papers. A copy of registration papers for ALL ponies entered MUST accompany entries along with appropriate fees.

Persons leasing ponies SHALL have written lease agreement from CLRC and photocopy of the registration papers.

Eligibility: All Ponies/Cobs must be registered in the studbook of the Welsh Pony & Cob Society of Canada or the Welsh Pony & Cob Society of America or, if under one year, be eligible for registration.

A Pony/Cob must be shown under its full registered Welsh name and number. All lease agreements must be officially recorded through the Society office. All recorded leases are designated as such on the animal's Certificate of Registration. Leased animals being shown must present a copy of registration listing the lessee.

Welsh Pony & Cob Society of Canada Ambassador Awards:

Welsh Ponies and Cobs often compete in open competitions in all disciplines against many other breeds and very often, come out on top.

In order to recognize these "ambassadors" of the Welsh Breed, an award program was initiated in 2017 to recognize the ponies and cobs that compete outside of our regular breed shows. The Welsh Pony & Cob Society of Canada will present up to 10 awards per year.

These awards are available for Registered Purebred Welsh Ponies and Cobs, as well as registered Half-Welsh competing against other breeds in open classes, in all Disciplines, including, but not limited to **Dressage**, **Pleasure Driving**, **CDE**, **Derby**, **Endurance**, **Eventing**, **Hunter/Jumper**, **Reining**, **Western Pleasure**, **Equitation**, **Para-Equestrian**, **etc.** Submissions from multiple disciplines are acceptable.

WPCSC High Point & Reserve High Point Welsh Awards:

High Point Awards, sponsored by the WPCSC, will be presented at the Western Canadian Pony Classic to the two registered Welsh ponies earning the highest total points across all classes at the show.

Welsh Pony & Cob Society of America Open Show Program:

The Welsh Pony & Cob Society of America (WPCSA) recognizes Welsh Ponies, Welsh Cobs and Half-Welsh/Part-Bred competing in events against all breeds with two special award programs - the WPCSA Year-End Open Awards and the Welsh Medallion Award program. Open Competition participants are automatically entered in the Medallion Program.

To be eligible for these awards, participating animals must be registered with WPCSA. The owner of the pony/cob/Half-Welsh/Part-Bred must be a current WPCSA member. Both the event (show) and the class entered must be open to all breeds. The program is open to Canadian Welsh ponies and cobs as well.

Each division requires an annual fee. Please see each individual set of guidelines for all rules specific to each Division Year-End Category and Medallion point allocation or requirements. Unless otherwise noted, all Division Categories are open to both Adult and Junior exhibitors and points are accumulated on the Equine entrants alone. CLASS/DIVISION SPECIFICATIONS AND INFORMATION

IN-HAND DIVISIONS

Pony Hunter Breeding

The Pony Hunter Breeding classes are for young stock ages 3 years and under. Classes are generally divided by age and gender. To be shown at a walk and trot only. Ponies will be judged based on their quality, conformation, movement, suitability as a future hunter pony and breeding animal to produce future hunter ponies. Open to all breeds, registered or non-registered but should be of hunter type.

Sport Pony and

Star Search Sport Pony Classes (these are qualifying classes for the Toronto Royal Winter Fair)

Sport Pony classes are open to ponies of all ages. Classes are generally divided by age and gender. To be shown at a walk and trot only. Ponies will be judged on movement and conformation/type. Sport ponies should be capable of excelling in the hunter, jumper, eventing or dressage disciplines. Open to all breeds, registered or non-registered but should be of sport type.

Welsh Breed Classes

Welsh classes are open only to Welsh ponies and cobs registered with the WPCSC or the WPCSA. Classes are generally divided by age and gender. To be shown at a walk and trot only. Purebred Welsh to be judged on breed type, conformation, way of going, quality and substance and disposition and manners. Natural reaching action is desired. Half-Welsh to be judged on conformation, way of going, quality and substance and on Welsh breed type, disposition and manners.

National Dressage Pony Cup Breeding Classes

There are two divisions of Dressage Breeding classes: Pony – open to all pony breeds, registered or non-registered that are 14.2hh or under and Small Horse- open to all horse breeds, registered or non-registered that are over 14.2hh but under 16hh. Both divisions to be shown at a walk and trot only. To be shown on the triangle. Animals will be judged on movement and conformation/type and should be capable of excelling in dressage.

All of the above in-hand divisions will be double judged, except Dressage Breeding classes.

PERFORMANCE DIVISIONS

Separate Divisions shall be offered for Junior and Adult competitors, unless otherwise stated:

- a) Junior Division: Open to junior riders until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 18 years of age.
- b) Senior Division: Open to senior riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 19 years of age.

English Classes

<u>Leadline</u>

Open to junior exhibitors aged ten years and under. To be led by an adult. The leading rein to be attached to the cavesson of the bridle. No chain leadlines allowed. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English attire is acceptable. To walk only. Riders ineligible for other ridden classes, except Leading Rein and Costume.

Leading Rein

Open to junior exhibitors aged ten years and under. To be shown on a light contact and led by an adult. The leading rein to be attached to the cavesson on the English bridle while leaving control of the pony to the child. No chain leadlines allowed. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English attire is acceptable. To be shown at the walk and trot on a pattern. Ponies will be called out individually to perform their patterns. Ponies to be judged on manners, suitability, conformation, movement and turn-out. This is not an equitation class. **Except in an extreme emergency, the leaders shall not touch any part of the rider, pony or tack.** Both handler and rider to be appropriately dressed in English attire. Riders ineligible for other ridden classes, except Leadline and Costume.

First Ridden

Open to junior exhibitors ten years of age and under, mounted on ponies 13.2hh and under. Riders to be suitably dressed in English attire. To show both ways of the ring at a walk and trot. Ponies to be judged on performance, manners and suitability. Conformation, way of going, manners, suitability and turnout to be emphasized. This is not an equitation class. Riders may only show in other walk/trot classes.

Novice English Pleasure

Open to riders of all ages in their first year of competing in flat classes. Riders to be suitably dressed in English attire. To show both ways of the ring at a walk and trot. Ponies to be judged on performance only. This is not an equitation class. Riders may only show in other walk/trot classes.

Green Pony English Pleasure

Open to all ponies that are in their first or second year of showing under saddle in classes that require a canter. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring on light contact. To stand quietly and back readily. Ponies to be judged on performance only.

English Pleasure

To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring on light contact without a martingale. To stand quietly and back readily. Ponies to be judged on performance only.

English Equitation

To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring on light contact without a martingale. To stand quietly and back readily. To be judged on the rider's appearance, seat, hands and control of their mount.

Trail Classes

Open to all ponies. This division offers both in-hand and ridden, junior and senior classes. English or Western equipment is acceptable. To be shown over and through obstacles. In-hand at a walk, optional trot or jog and ridden at a walk, trot and optional canter or lope. To be judged 100% on performance.

Driving Classes

Working Pleasure Driving – Novice

Open to drivers of all ages in their first year of competing in driven classes. To be shown to a suitable two-wheeled vehicle but not a racing sulky or fine harness rig. Use of a bike style vehicle with floorboards and a basket is acceptable. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, working trot, stand quietly and back readily. Ponies to be judged on performance only.

Green Pony Working Pleasure Driving

Open to all ponies that are in their first or second year of showing in harness. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, working trot, and trot on and stand quietly and back readily. Ponies to be judged on performance only.

Working Pleasure Driving

To be shown to a suitable two or four-wheeled vehicle or four-wheeled vehicle for pairs, but not a viceroy, racing sulky or fine harness rig. Use of a bike style vehicle with floorboards and a basket is acceptable. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, working trot, and trot on and stand quietly and except for tandems, to back readily. Classes limited to junior drivers shall be asked to do a walk and working trot, to stand quietly and back readily. A properly attired groom or passenger capable of rendering assistance in case of an emergency is required for all pairs and tandems. Failure to comply will result in elimination from the class. Ponies to be judged on performance only.

Pleasure Driving, Reinsmanship

A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the ability and skill of the driver. To be shown at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot. Shall be required to rein back. All drivers chosen for a work off may be worked at any gait requested by the judge and may be asked to execute a figure of eight and/or perform other appropriate tests. Either the one or two-handed method of driving is acceptable. To be judged on handling of reins and whip, control, posture and overall appearance of driver, condition of harness and vehicle and neatness of attire.

Hunter Classes

Ponies may not be entered in more than two consecutive height divisions.

Trot Pole Division

To be shown at a trot over a small course of poles on the ground. Trot poles to be judged on performance only. Equitation to be judged on equitation and suitability of mount. Riders may only show in other walk/trot classes, including Crossrails, at the trot.

Crossrail Division

To be shown at a trot or canter over a small course of crossrails. Crossrails to be judged on performance only. Equitation to be judged on equitation and suitability of mount.

Hunter Over Fences

To be shown at a canter over a small course of a designated height. Classes range from 2' - 2'9". To be judged on performance only.

Hunter Equitation Over Fences

To be shown at a canter over a small course of a designated height. Classes range from 2' – 2'9". To be judged on hands, seat, control and suitability of mount.

Hunter Under Saddle

To be eligible, pony must have shown in and completed an over fence class in the same division. To be shown at the walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. To be judged on performance, manners, movement, style and conformation.

Jumper Classes

Ponies may not be entered in more than two consecutive height divisions.

Clear Rounds

To be shown over a show jumping course of a designated height. All ponies that go clear within the allowed time will receive a red ribbon. No jump off.

Optimum Time

To be shown over a show jumping course of a designated height. The optimum time is predetermined by the course designer. The goal is to complete the course as close to the optimum time as possible without incurring time faults.

Jumper Class (Table A)

To be shown over a show jumping course of a designated height. Competitors will jump their first round, aiming to go clear, within time allowed. Those with clear rounds come back for the jump off, which is a shortened version of the first course.

National Dressage Pony Cup Classes

There are two sections of dressage: Pony and Small Horse in both the ridden and breeding divisions. Both sections are open to both junior and senior competitors.

Ridden

Includes five divisions – introductory, training, first level, second level and third level, in which competitors may ride their test of choice. Ridden classes are divided based on height – Pony (14.2hh and under) or Small Horse (above 14.2hh but under 16 hh).

Breeding Division

This division offers in-hand classes on the triangle for young and mature ponies and small horses.



Royal Winter Fair Qualifying Classes

Ponies will be measured at the Royal and MUST be 14.2 and under in order to compete. It is the owner's responsibility to make sure their pony meets the height requirement. We strongly encourage ponies entering these classes to be measured at the Western Canadian Pony Classic.



Welsh Champion of Champions Qualifier – Sponsored by Northwind Farm

These are in-hand classes for registered, purebred Welsh Ponies and Cobs and are a qualifier for the Royal Winter Fair.

- a) YOUNGSTOCK: Eligible are the 1st placed ponies/cobs from the Section A 2 & Under class Section B 2 & Under class, and Section C/D 2 & Under class.
- b) BROODMARE OR YELD MARE: Eligible are the 1st placed ponies/cobs from the Section A Mare class, Section B Mare class, and Section C/D Mare class.
- c) STALLION/GELDING: Eligible are the 1st placed ponies/cobs from the Section A Stallion/Gelding classes, Section B Stallion/Gelding classes, and Section C/D Stallion/Gelding classes.

In the event that the first-place pony has already qualified then the 2nd placed pony is eligible to compete in their respective section. Judge: Shawn Bigley.

2025 Starsearch Sportpony Qualifier Classes

This division is open to any registered or unregistered pony meeting the sport pony criteria IE. hunter, jumping, driving, eventing, etc. The first place in each of the 8 classes will qualify to enter the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair Sportpony Division. If the first place pony has previously qualified at a qualifier show this year then the second place will advance. There must be at least 2 competing in each class in order to qualify. It is the RESPONSIBILITY of the 2nd place handler to obtain the information at the time of placing from the first place handler if the 1st pony has previously qualified. Ponies will be measured at the Royal and MUST be 14.2 and under in order to compete. General EC rules for Sporthorses apply. At the Royal SPORTPONY STARSEARCH winner will be awarded the perpetual MORTON SPORTPONY STARSEARCH CHALLENGE CUP, a silver keeper plate and our sponsors DENWORTH EQUINE MANAGEMENT Sherri Whitworth-Denouden & Jeremy Denouden award a total of \$1000.00 prize money to the top 4 & a cooler to the Supreme Champion.

Stakes Classes

Competitors and their ponies must compete in all other classes in their division to be eligible for the stakes classes. Stakes classes must have a minimum of four entries to pay out. The minimum payout will be \$120/stakes class. The pot for each stakes class will pay out as follows:

- First Place 50%
- Second Place 30%
- Third Place 20%



Novelty Classes

These classes are just for fun and are not awarded points. The novelty classes include:

Don't Spill Derby

Riders must complete a short course of 2' fences, while holding a glass of water. The rider with the fewest number of faults and least amount of water spilled wins.

Bribe Your Pony

Competitors will lead their pony into the arena, then unclip the lead rope and guide their pony through a small obstacle course using only treats and your voice, no touching!! The pair that successfully completes the course in the fastest time wins.

Bareback Barrel Race

Just like barrel racing, but without the saddle! The rider who goes clean in the shortest amount of time wins.

Liberty Class

This class is performed to music. A handler and assistant are allowed into the ring, both are allowed whips. Once the music begins to play, the handler will remove the pony's halter and the pony has two minutes to show off their movement in all gaits. During this time the handler and assistant may not touch the pony and neither may their whips. At two minutes the music will stop and the handler then has two minutes to catch their pony. Handler and assistant are encouraged to dress alike or dress in costume (maybe as the singer/band they have chosen). Pony will not be penalized for playful behaviour. Competitors will be penalized if they cannot catch their pony in the two minute time period or if they or their whip touches the pony during the two minutes the music is playing.

Hobby Horse Class

Don't have a pony? No problem! Bring your hobby horse and enter the Hobby Horse Class!

Tack Dash

Competitors enter the arena leading their horse, which must be outfitted in a halter. At the go, competitors bridle their horses and ride bareback to the opposite end of the ring, where their saddles and pads are waiting. Riders must then finish tacking up their horse and the first one back to the other side of the arena is the winner.

Costume Class

Get creative! We want to see all your gorgeous costumes! Competitors will show at a walk only, but may lead, ride or drive their ponies.

Fossils Over Fences

Only for those riders 40 years and over! Riders will compete over a short .70m jumper course.


